Advocacy

Leading the Profession

Provide music educators and leaders with engaging professional development opportunities and resources to support best practices and serve the needs of students

- A. Lead professional and personal development by providing dynamic and effective resources, materials, publications, and learning opportunities
- B. Build the capacity of future leaders in our profession
- C. Foster activity in recruiting and retaining music teachers, maintaining the vitality of the profession

Capacity Building

Ensure sound fiscal practices and decision making to advance our association and the profession we serve.

- A. Increase membership in existing and new categories.
- B. Ensure a fiscally sound Association.
- C. Exemplify our mission and vision in all programs and projects.
- D. Empower committees, councils, and members to achieve the Association's mission and vision.

Research

Create and support partnerships between researchers and practitioners to improve practice and expand knowledge.

- A. Publish and promote the "Missouri Journal of Research in Music Education."
- B. Share research and knowledge with internal and external audiences, presented in a way that is accessible to those audiences.

Mission

The Missouri Music Educators Association, a federated association of the National Association for Music Education clearly focuses on effectively serving the membership in their goals of teaching and learning, by promoting a comprehensive music education program that furthers music making by all and supports the advancement of music education as a profession.

Vision

Every student in Missouri shall have access and exposure to a well-balanced, comprehensive, sequential, and high-quality program of music instruction taught by fully certified music teachers.

Strategic Direction #1: Advocacy

- O Develop a detailed plan for advancing a legislative agenda that will identify music as a core subject and articulate instructional requirements for music in statute
- o Develop a support network of music education advocates consisting of parents and other community members from across the state dedicated to advocating on the local and state level
- o Increase involvement of Tri-M and NAfME-C members in the advocacy network
- Identify arts related policy agendas of candidates and provide information to MMEA, advocates and the public
- o Increase public awareness of the relevance and importance of music education
- o Develop online resources for training of advocates
- o Create and maintain relationships with Department of Education, Governor's Office, legislative leaders, and other arts organizations
- o Declare March as MIOSM via proclamation from Governor's office

Strategic Direction #2: Leading the Profession

- o Continue to expand the mentoring program to be a year-long outreach to young teachers
- o Expand the intentional training of mentors and increase involvement throughout the year
- Continue to promote Tri-M through publicity of the Leadership Summit and involvement in advocacy efforts
- o Continue to develop the Leadership Program by providing training to existing leaders and recruit the next generation of state and local leadership
- Assess the needs of the membership and offer relative clinic sessions that meet those needs at the annual In Service/Workshop
- o Identify and implement policies of inclusion and equity in all aspects of the organization
- o Publish and support the Missouri School Music magazine as a resource for members
- o Expand professional development resources on the MMEA website
- Increase activities related to music instruction for students with special needs, inclusion and adaptive instruction
- o MMEA will investigate curriculum changes and develop strategies and resources to assist the music educator with new developments for effective music education.

Strategic Direction #3: Capacity Building

- o Increase membership in all areas of MMEA by 10%, focusing on teachers in the urban and rural areas
- Continue accounting and finance practices that ensure clarity and fiscal responsibility
- Expand sponsorship opportunities
- o Maintain existing relationship with music affiliates, serving as an umbrella to promote their activities through the state conference
- Review and update the MMEA Strategic Plan and Constitution, By-Laws, and Policy and Procedures Manual annually
- o Document and compile job descriptions for all board positions and staff

Strategic Direction #4: Research

- o Publish and promote the Missouri Journal of Research in Music Education
- o Expand the website to include a database for research
- Expand the website to include a members only section that includes professional development videos and articles
- o Facilitate collaborations between music education researchers and practitioners to undertake research specific to Missouri that will drive informed practices and innovation
